But the plans of the Lord stand firm forever, the purposes of his heart through all generations. (Psalm 33:11, NIV)

(28) "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. (29) Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. (30) For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28–30, NIV)

(34) So Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, (35) but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him." (Acts 10:34–35, ESV)

1. **God created me to _____ me.**

The Lord appeared to us in the past, saying: “I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness. (Jeremiah 31:3, NIV)

For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love (5) he predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will. (Ephesians 1:4–5 NIV)

2. **We were created to _____ a personal relationship with God and to**

_____ **all of the rest of God’s creation. This makes us special.**

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. (28) And God blessed them. And God said to them, “Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth.” (Genesis 1:27–28, ESV)

As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy. (1 Timothy 6:17, ESV)

What's the Problem?

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—everyone—to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. (Isaiah 53:6, ESV)

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. (1 John 1:8, ESV)

Sin breaks our close relationship with God. It causes us to fear God and try to live our lives outside of his will.

Your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, and your sins have hidden his face from you so that he does not hear. (Isaiah 59:2, ESV)

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23, ESV)

When our relationship with God is not right, it causes problems in every area of our lives—marriage, career, relationships, finances, etc.

There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death. (Proverbs 16:25, ESV)

Even when we know that our deepest need is God, we often try wrong ways of getting to know him.

What's the Solution?

Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

JOHN 14:6 (NIV)

God himself came to earth as a human being to bring us back to himself. If any other way would have worked, Jesus Christ would not have had to come. The way is in the person of Jesus Christ.

The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

God did this for us because he loves us and wants us to know him.

ROMANS 5:8 (AP)

1 TIMOTHY 2:5 (TLB)
