Pastor Doug and Marie Brushell started the church on October 13th, 1996, as a church plant from the Cicero Believers Chapel. The church started on Center Street in Canastota and later moved to the current location on Route 5 in 1998.

In 2012 Pastor Doug left his position here at the church and stepped into the eternal presence of Jesus.

Pastor Dave and Mary Allen moved into the Pastoral role during 2012 and ushered in the next phase of the church. Pastor Dave retired January of 2021.

February 1st 2021 Pastor Jake and Jamie Rashford became the pastors for the next season. Changing the name of the church to The Way Ministries and setting in a new vision and mission for the church.
